Dr. Bianco developed Pathways2Teaching to encourage high school students in urban and rural areas to become teachers in and for their own communities.

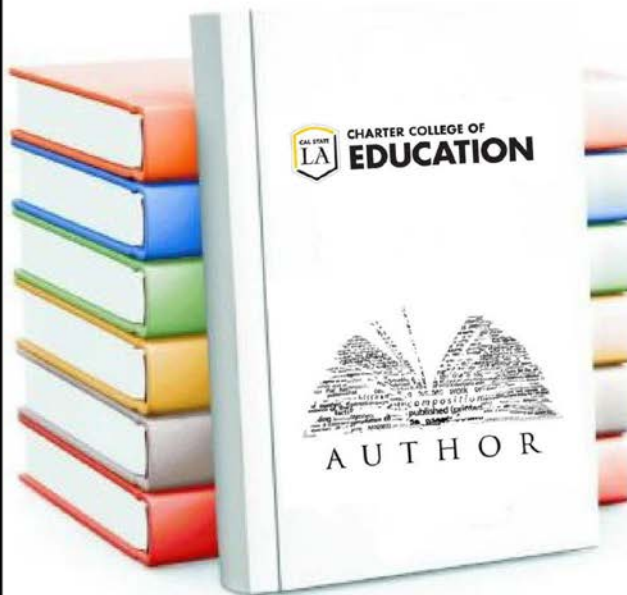

The New CCOE Mascot: A Humanoid Robot

At Opening Day, members of the CCOE community had an opportunity to meet, Nao, nicknamed, "Kapono," a Humanoid Robot. Kapono, derived from the Hawaiian name meaning "the good/moral one," is imagined and manufactured by Aldebaran Robotics, stands 23.5 inches tall, weighs 9.5 lbs., sports 4 microphones, several

tactical sensors located on the head, hands, feet, and can be connected to the internet.

There are currently 7,000 of these Nao robots in distribution throughout the world in education, hospitality, retail, and medical sectors. Thanks to Dean Ney for her forward thinking in providing Kapono as part of the CCOE's Maker Space in support of academic research and STEM education.

Dr. Doyle-Nichols will be introducing Kapono to EDIT students this fall. Congratulations also go to our IT Team – Dave Wong, Russell Young, and Wendy Tran for their work with Kapono!!!

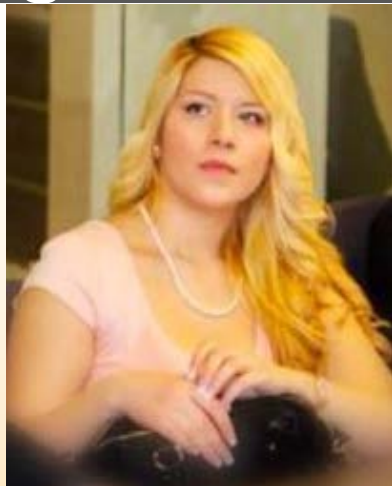

Yuen Given 2017 Lifetime Achievement Award

CCOE Professor Emeritus, Dr. Gay Yuen was recently given the 2017 Lifetime Achievement Award by the Presidents' Circle of the Chinese-American Elected Officials (CEO).
